Hand Sanitizer Lawyer On Toxins Entering The Body And Methanol Poisoning Lawsuits

Hand sanitizer lawyers are closely monitoring the reports of methanol poisoning and related lawsuits. The FDA warns consumers that the agency has seen a sharp increase in methanol hand sanitizer products. There are now more than 75 varieties of hand sanitizers that have been recalled. With the increased demand for hand sanitizer has come some dangerous and false labeled products. Many of these dangerous products are labeled to contain ethanol, but have

tested positive for methanol contamination. Methanol is a substance that can be toxic when absorbed through the skin or ingested.

The FDA clearly states that methanol is not an acceptable active ingredient for hand sanitizers. Further, methanol must not be used in hand sanitizer due to its toxic effects. The use of methanol hand sanitizers causes health issues including blindness, kidney failure, and death. Anyone who suspects that they have defective hand sanitizers should check the FDA recall list. Additionally, even if the product is not currently on the list, they should be aware of any symptoms of methanol toxicity. Persons injured by these products should contact a hand sanitizer lawyer to discuss a potential Methanol poisoning lawsuit or claim.

Methanol Poisoning Lawsuits, Causes, Symptoms, and Treatment of Wood Alcohol Toxicity By Hand Sanitizer Lawyer

Methanol poisoning toxicity occurs when a person ingests or is exposed to methanol. Further, methanol poisoning causes a variety of symptoms including coordination problems, vomiting, abdominal pain, and vision problems. Additionally, long-term or heavy exposure can cause blindness, kidney failure, or death. When methanol is broken down by the body it forms toxins including formaldehyde, formic acid, and formate. Methanol poisoning can be detected through blood test. If you suspect that you or a loved one has suffered methanol toxicity it is important to seek medical assistance immediately. More specifically, early treatment of methanol toxicity can stabilize the person and use of an antidote can often prevent further injuries. The FDA warns individuals and doctors about several products that are supposed to contain ethanol, but instead contain methanol. Many of these dangerous and mislabeled products test positive for methanol, but clearly state that they contain ethanol. Unfortunately, many consumers use these sanitizers then experience cognitive, coordination, and vision issues. In more severe cases, these people suffer blindness, kidney failure, or poisoning that cause death.

Healthcare professionals, caretakers, and other essential workers commonly must use hand sanitizers regularly. For this reason, essential workers are unfortunately at an increased risk for using methanol hand sanitizers. Therefore, essential workers and their employers should verify

that they have safe hand sanitizers. Additionally, if you or a loved one believe you are using defective hand sanitizer, it is important to check the FDA website and report any unsafe products. Further, if you or a loved one are experiencing toxic effects after using hand sanitizer, it is important to report these adverse events. It is also important to seek the advice of a medical professional. A doctor can often help attempt to reverse the toxic effects. Wood Alcohol or Methyl Alcohol Has a Long History Rooted In the United States Long Before Hand Sanitizer

Wood alcohol, also known as methanol, is nothing new. The ancient Egyptians previously used wood spirits for embalming. More recently methyl alcohol was a health problem during alcohol prohibition in the United States. When bootleggers ran clandestine ethanol stills to make whiskey, methanol toxicity became a problem. Methanol is a byproduct of the ethanol distilling process. Distillers have to be very careful in removing the poisons such as wood alcohol when they make drinkable alcohol. Many prohibition distillers did not remove the methyl alcohol and then sold the poison to unsuspecting purchasers on the bootleg market. This became a widespread health crisis and caused many of the same health problems that defective hand sanitizer products are causing today.

Recent FDA Announced Recall of 4e Brands North America Nationwide Hand Sanitizer

The FDA has recently announced the nationwide recall of all 4e Brands North America hand sanitizer products within expiration. Assured, Blumen, and Modesa are some of the recalled hand sanitizer products from 4e Brands North America. They recall announcement is related to the potential presence of methanol or wood alcohol. The 4e Brands North America hand sanitizer products are marketed to help reduce bacteria and viruses on the skin.

Recent FDA Announced Recall of Resource Recovery and Trading, LLC and MXL Comercial S.A. de C.V. Hand Sanitizer Products

The FDA has recently announced the nationwide recall of some of Resource Recovery and Trading, LLC and MXL Comercial S.A. de C.V. hand sanitizer products. Recalled products include those manufactured by MXL Comercial S.A. de C.V. such as Hand Sanitizer 70 percent Ethyl Alcohol Disinfectant Gel, packaged in 6.7 FL Oz. bottles, UPC 650240026020 and Hand Sanitizer Non-sterile Solution 70 percent Topical Solution, packaged in 20L liter plastic containers, UPC 37710600013 to the consumer level. The recall announcement is related to the use of hand sanitizer that contains methanol or does not contain enough ethyl alcohol. This can cause the potential for decreased bactericidal and virucidal activity or methanol toxicity.

Recent FDA Announced Recall of Broncolin S.A. de C.V. Herbacil Antiseptic Hand Sanitizer 70 Percent Alcohol

The FDA has recently announced the recall of Broncolin S.A. de C.V. Herbacil Antiseptic Hand Sanitizer 70 Percent alcohol. The voluntary recall announcement is due to the possible presence of methanol. All package sizes are labeled with a blue label identifying INBC Trading LLC. These products were distributed nationwide in the USA.

Q1: "What Types of Defective Hand Sanitizer Claims Does a Methanol Poisoning Lawyer Handle?"

A1: *A defective hand sanitizer lawyer reviews methanol poisoning claims. These claims commonly include blindness and vision problems, kidney failure, and fatal methanol poisoning. Medical records from the diagnosing medical professional are typically needed as well as death certificates and/or autopsies.*

Q3: What types of injuries and damages are typically needed to justify filing a methanol poisoning lawsuit or claim?

A3: *Typically, injury lawyers only file defective hand sanitizer claims when the product causes fatal or serious injuries. More specifically, many of these claims include deaths, kidney failure, other organ failure, or blindness. Further, hand sanitizer injuries typically need to cause significant medical expenses, impairment, or death to justify the expense of filing a lawsuit. However, each claim and hand sanitizer attorney are different and damages from each methanol poisoning should be reviewed on its own merit.*
